PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Symposium: The Louis Sullivan Terra Cotta Symposium commemorates 150 years since the birth of Louis Sullivan on September 3, 1866. Sullivan was one of the most prolific and accomplished American architects inspired by terra cotta and its application in late 19th and early 20th century architecture. This symposium brings together professional speakers who will discuss the technology and early manufacturing period of terra cotta in the United States starting in the 1850s, how Louis Sullivan and other architects played a key role in the evolution, development, and use of terra cotta throughout the 20th Century, and the continuing evolution of conservation practice and techniques for the care of terra cotta today. The symposium will be held at the Cooper Union, one of the oldest known structures in the United States utilizing terra cotta.

Bayard-Condict Tour: Formal presentations will be followed a tour of the Bayard-Condict Building, Sullivan's only New York City building, completed in 1899 and restored in 2002.

Woolworth Building Evening Cocktail Reception: The symposium will conclude with a cocktail reception will take place in the elegant lobby of the Woolworth Building built in 1911, one of the earliest examples of terra cotta skyscrapers in New York.
